### **Lay Leader Moment**

In April 2007 we launched a three-year capital campaign. Our response was outstanding with \$466,005 pledged on a goal of \$350,000. To date we have received \$318,926. This shortfall of \$146,178 is a reflection of the tough economic times and it is understandable that some members have not been able to meet their

pledge within the three-year period. However, payments are still being made and we are proud of and grateful for this ongoing support.

We can also be proud of the projects that have been completed: a new boiler, parking lot lighting, sealing and re-stripping of parking lot, new windows in the educational wing, renovation and upgrade of the Sinclair Room restrooms, replacement of air conditioning units for the sanctuary and repairing of the foundation drainage system. As with everything else in our economy, the cost of these projects was considerably more than was estimated in 2007.

As of April 9, 2010, there was \$42,623.70 in the Building Fund portion of the Capital Campaign Fund. This is not enough to complete other projects needed to maintain and improve our church building. Among the remaining projects are: central air conditioning for the education wing (\$48,000), caulking and tuck-pointing of mortar and coping (waiting on estimate), power washing the entire building (\$6,000), replacing air conditioning in the Fellowship Hall (\$13,700), paving of new handicapped parking spaces near the ramp (\$5,000), and replacing the canopy with an improved entrance (\$50,000 +). In addition, further inspection of our stained glass windows is pending.

As of April 8, 2010 there was \$78,920.47 in the Gills House Fund. It is expected that about \$35,000 will be used for structural repairs and the remainder will be available to pay down the mortgage which is currently \$172,624.

You can see that this presents us with a real challenge and opportunity. You know, we always do our best when we are faced with a challenge. The opportunity gives us the privilege of doing God's work through Lakeside United Methodist church.

To effectively plan the work on those outstanding projects, we need a "ball park" figure of income. My challenge to all is to make a pledge to give to the Capital Campaign for at least another year. For those of you who have not pledged or participated in this Capital Campaign, please take this opportunity to become a part of it. A Pledge Card for everyone is enclosed.

Please complete your Pledge Card and present it for consecration on Sunday, May 16, 2010. If you cannot be present on that Sunday, please bring it by our church office.

We are a growing church on the cutting edge of diversified changes. Please pray about what you would like our church to be as we continue to do God's work in meeting the needs of our community.

## News from Kip and Nancy Robinson - Friday, April 16, 2010

Kip and I have been in Honduras a week amazed at how time is flying by! We spent last weekend in San Pedro Sula visiting first with Peggy Kipps, the director of the Ruth Paz Foundation for Burned Children, getting to know the 'ins and outs' of how we are connected as we work together and gleaning ideas for the future of our work together as Pediatric Cardiac teams and Medical Mountain Teams continue to offer their love and service to the children here. She was kind enough to lend us her car and a very capable driver, a young man in University who has hopes to become a psychologist some day. His very caring nature and listening abilities sure stood out. Sunday brought the opportunity to attend the Mennonite church where the Flores family attends and worship. Many members of the congregation are ready to provide the cardiac team with donations of units of blood to support the work in September. One of Melvin's three brothers is a doctor who would like to join us on one of the medical mountain teams at some point. Another brother is an engineer, and the third is a businessman (and a Florida State graduate).

Monday we headed to Peña Blanca and a reunion with the staff, first of all visiting with Esmeralda in her home to offer our sympathy on the loss of her son. She continues to face the days of grief with courage and although she had a strong spirit, her heart is broken, as a mother feeling the pain of powerlessness in the face of the tragic circumstances of Olvin's death. We have continued to offer her our presence and love as she quietly goes about her work here. The Friends of Barnabas Foundation has an amazing, loving and dedicated staff here who care deeply for each other and those they serve.

The plantains are developing, at various stages, with some in flower and some growing towards full ripeness already. The trees are FULL of different kinds of birds every morning and serenade us as we wake up to each new day. The hills are as green as ever. It has rained during the night twice, but for the most part, this is a dry and hot season, although a steady breeze tempers the heat. Working alongside the staff, meeting families and children, participating in daily devotions and prayer and dreaming of the future fills the hours. Our God is so good.

We have an office set up in our room using a folding table as our desk and a wireless Internet connection most of the time. It doesn't get much better, and as I told the pastors at the seminar we had with them on Wednesday. *Nuestra casa es su casa. Este es un lugar de salud y oracion.* The Barnabas House is open to all as a place of healing and prayer. *My Father's house shall be called a house of prayer.* Yes, many pastors from the surrounding community came together here to focus on pastoral care, the needs of the community and how we might work together. The power of prayer and caring hearts undergird all the work that we do. Some of these pastors have expressed a willingness to come early each morning to offer a devotion and pray for the patients who arrive for the day.

Pasquala left yesterday for a month-long practicum as part of her nursing (she is focusing on public health and nursing), so we welcomed Ada, a young nurse who comes to help as needed. She will travel with Team #4 next week. Today we are scrubbing and making beds with much excitement. Kip and Elmer trekked into SPS yesterday to buy food to feed the multitudes it seems, although we discovered this morning they forgot to get the beans...imagine life in Honduras without beans...staple of life! Kip has been driving each day as the van heads out to take the staff to their respective homes. He has passed the test of the staff...they boo or applaud his handling of every bump in the road. There is a definite *alegria*, a joy and rhythm to life here which is soothing to the soul.

We will travel to San Pedro Sula on Saturday to welcome Team #4 led by Ronnie and Betty Dillon.

*Buen viaje.* Have a safe trip. To all of you reading, we are so very thankful for your support of the work in Honduras, especially financially, as you respond to the leading of the Holy Spirit. We can only do what we do as God leads and provides, we are the Body of Christ together serving the children here in Honduras.

*Que Dios los bendiga.* God Bless all of you.

## **Random Thoughts**

### March Madness

As I write this we have just seen the NCAA men's basketball tournament, often referred to as "March Madness". In a newsletter I received from my denomination's pension plan, there is an interesting story about the origin of the game of basketball which I never knew. Here is some of what the newsletter says.

In 1891, James Naismith, a theologian, was convinced he stood a better chance of exemplifying the Christian life through sports than through preaching. So he took a job as a physical education instructor at the YMCA's International Training School for Christian Workers in Springfield, Mass. There he set out to invent a new indoor game that students could play during winter. He spent weeks testing various games, including versions of soccer, football, and lacrosse, to no avail.

Finally, he decided to draw from all of these sports, with a ball that could be easily handled, play that involved running and passing with no tackling, and with a goal at each end of the floor. From the beginning Naismith held the players to a high standard. As Naismith's athletic director, Luther Gulick wrote, "The game must be kept clean. A Christian college cannot tolerate slugging and that which violates the elementary principles of morals."

In the last 100+ years we have seen no shortage of Christian athletes who use their skill, self-discipline, and sportsmanship as a witness to Christ--from Olympic runner Eric Liddel in the 1920's to football player Tim Tebow in our own generation.

If you have a young basketball fan in your family, tell him or her the story of how and why basketball was invented. And pray for Christian players who can use the public's love of sports the way Naismith envisioned when he invented basketball as a witnessing tool to, in his words "win men for the Master through the gym."

## **Council Notes**

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by Co-Chair Wes Fergusson. Devotions were beautifully led by Sue Swadley based on Matthew 25. Minutes of the March meeting were read and approved. Nature Ministry gave a brief report on the booklet being prepared which will list the opportunities to serve at Lakeside. Bill Giese, Chair of Trustees stated he had met with John Taylor concerning air conditioning of the Education building. The estimate to do the first floor is approximately \$24,000. Council approved air conditioning for the first floor. Bill reported that the installation of additional security lights has been completed. Thanks to Troop 759, and specifically the Eagle Scout project of Trevor Brown, we have a beautiful new fence on the Waldo side of the parking lot. Bill also reported on meeting with a stained glass representative from Philadelphia who found no major problems with our windows. He did recommend an inspection every three to five years. The Trustees presented a report on the Audio/Visual improvement for the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. The visual improvement in the Sanctuary includes new wall-mounted projectors and video monitors for the choir and is estimated to cost \$18,000. This portion was deferred for six months. The more needed audio upgrade for the Fellowship hall was estimated to cost \$11,000. There is \$6,200 in a specials account for this purpose. Council approved the use of funds from undesignated Memorial funds to complete this project. Dave Poole presented a letter on the extension of the Capital Campaign. He plans to include the letter and a pledge card in the May newsletter. The purpose is to request that those who made a three-year pledge continue their giving so we can complete some much needed improvements. Also, the letter will offer an opportunity to newer members to take part in this program. Financial reports were given by Hal Costley and are on file in the church office. For the first quarter, our deficit is \$8,813.66.

It was reported that asbestos testing has been completed at the Gills House and as soon as the report is received, we can submit plans to the county. The Ministry Focus area for May will be the Pre-school. Pastor Charles Swadley reported that we have had over 200 persons at worship seven times this year. So far this year we have received 21 new members. We are blessed! Reverend Swadley closed the meeting with a prayer.

## **Policy Changes**

Listed below are changes in wording for two of the church's policies:

18. At least two bids shall be obtained for all capital and maintenance expenditures or equipment, excluding emergencies, which cost more than \$1,000. This regulation applies to expenditures which will come from the General Funds of the church. The scope of a project or expenditure must be brought to the Trustees for prior approval and recommendation. Next the project is presented to Finance for funding. The project is then taken before Council for final approval. Only an officer of the Board of Trustees can be responsible for signing the contract for any such work or expenditure.

19. Any and all individuals, groups, or organizations must obtain approval from the Board of Trustees prior to purchasing, presenting, or installing any gift, furniture, fixture or equipment with a value greater than \$500. This regulation applies to the aforementioned groups of persons, both within and outside the church, and further applies regardless of the source of funding. The board of trustees shall regularly report to the Church Council all such purchases or gifts.

## **Youth Ministry News**

April was a short month for our youth group; with the Easter Holiday and Spring Break, we only met for 1 youth group evening; but that didn't stop our youth from doing some work to help the church, and those less fortunate than us. On April 16 & 17 the youth had a service project lock-in at the church. Under the guidance of Bill Giese, the youth did some patching/painting in the bathrooms by the church office. We also helped unload the CARITAS truck when it arrived on Saturday April 17. Then on Sunday April 18, some of our youth assisted in serving dinner to the CARITAS group at the church. We commend the youth for all the work they do to help others in the community. During the month of May, the youth will host a Fundraiser lunch for the church (see details below) as well as begin to prepare for Youth Sunday which will be on Sunday, June 13. We hope you will come to support the youth and all they have accomplished this year.

**Youth Group Fundraiser** - On Sunday May 2 following the Morning Worship Service, the youth group will be hosting a fundraiser luncheon in the Fellowship Hall. The menu will consist of Chicken Parmesan on a bed of pasta, salad, rolls, drink, and desert. The cost will be \$6.00 per person, and \$24.00 per family (4 or more). We would like to take this time to ask for your help. The youth meet every Sunday night from 5:30-8:00. From 5:30-6:00, we offer the youth dinner. We need volunteers to help with this. It's easy! You would just need to be at the church by 5:15 (or earlier if use of kitchen is needed) to set up, serve your meal, and clean up the kitchen/space used. We would love to have families, Sunday school classes, groups that meet at the church or individuals to come share in fellowship with us.
